## Our Mission

**The mission of the U.S. Postal Inspection Service is to:**

- **Support and protect the U.S. Postal Service and its employees, infrastructure, and customers**
- **Enforce the laws that defend the nation's mail system from illegal or dangerous use**
- **Ensure public trust in the mail**



# Security Responsibilities

The Chief Postal Inspector is the Chief Security Officer of the U.S. Postal Service, responsible for issuing security regulations for the agency.

Postal Inspectors are responsible for security of:

- 596,000 employees
- 36,400 facilities
- 218,000 vehicles
- \$68 billion in annual revenue





# Law Enforcement Responsibilities

## Complement:

- 1,400 Postal Inspectors
- 660 Postal Police Officers
- 500 Professional, Technical, Forensic and Administrative Staff

## Jurisdiction for:

- More than 200 federal statutes
- Any crime involving the mail or targeting the US Postal Service





